

### WHAT IS THE HUB?

The Hub is a team of designated community and government agencies that meet weekly to address specific situations with those facing elevated level of risk, and develop immediate, coordinated and integrated responses through the mobilization of resources.

The Hub does not perform case management. Its purpose is to mitigate risk within 24-48 hours and connect individuals and families to services. Case management functions remain with the most appropriate agencies as determined by the Hub Situation Table.

### WHO DOES THE HUB SERVE?

The Hub works with families and individuals that are facing complex challenges and may need services from more than one community agency. We work together to ensure families and individuals are safe, healthy and have the opportunity to
