- Thanks to a state earmark, a site for the new nbCC center has been secured at 192 State
 Street in North Adams, adjacent to Goodwill and Childcare of the Berkshires.
 Transforming the existing property into a thriving hub for nbCC will require \$8 million.
- With a superb track record in securing public funding, the Coalition expects to raise \$5 million in state and federal grants for this project.
- The remaining \$3 million must come from private sources. The Coalition has begun conversations with our neighbors who have the capacity and vision to serve as coinvestors in a powerful engine of humane regional prosperity.
